






Figure 4: Platforms used for news, by age
















## **Local Value for All Project: 2022-2023**




- Multi-media news operations bringing its local news teams together across radio, TV and online for the first time.
- 2. Budget reprioritised from broadcast services towards online and multimedia production
  - close local television news programmes in Oxford and Cambridge
  - greater programme sharing between neighbouring Local Radio stations when audiences are lower.
- **3. New investigative reporting teams** across TV, radio and online.






Apologies for the different programming on @BBCRadioSolent today.

### Threat to Local Radio

- Frequent communication and discussion:
  - Local identified as central pillar to BBC Strategy
  - Ofcom requirements we CANNOT lose local radio or devalue it

## Work pressure: journalists would have to work across all platforms all the time

- Consultation with unions and staff
- Productivity assumptions how many stories do we need each person to work on – have we got enough people

Centralisation would lead to the loss of platform-specific identify

- Careful selection of the planning teams to ensure Radio, TV and online all represented
- All platforms involved in planning decisions


